NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order affecting the B1149 Holt Road from junction A140 Cromer Road to junction of New Drayton Lane in the PARISH OF HORSFORD because of construction of A140/NNDR interchange.

The road will be temporarily closed (except for access) from 31st July 2017 to 29th September 2017 for the duration of the works, expected to be about 61 days within the period.

Alternative route is via: Holt Road, Cromer Road, Reepham Road, Drayton Lane – (Hellesdon, Horsford, Horsham St. Faith and Newton St. Faith).

(If necessary the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Order).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.

In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance.



NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (HORSFORD) TEMPORARY TRAFFIC RESTRICTION ORDER 2017 ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984 SECTION 14(1)

ORDER prohibiting the use by vehicles of the B1149 Holt Road from junction A140 Cromer Road to junction of New Drayton Lane in the PARISH OF HORSFORD.

- Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order and whereas the Norfolk County Council as Traffic Authority for the Administrative County of Norfolk is satisfied that:-
 - (i) construction of A140/NNDR interchange is required at the B1149 Holt Road from junction A140 Cromer Road to junction of New Drayton Lane in the PARISH OF HORSFORD (hereinafter referred to as the said road) and:
 - (ii) that in consequence traffic over the said road should be prohibited with effect from 31st July 2017 to 29th September 2017 for the duration of the works expected to be about 61 days within the period.
- Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall make it unlawful for a vehicle which
 requires access, to proceed to a final destination situated within the length of
 road specified in Article 1 of this Order.
- 3. This Order has a maximum duration of 18 months and will be revoked upon completion of the works. Where exceptional circumstances are encountered during the performance of the works specified in this Order the operational period of this Order may become extended to allow completion of the works after obtaining consent of the Secretary of State.

NOW THEREFORE the Norfolk County Council DO HEREBY ORDER, that with effect from 31st July 2017 to 29th September 2017 for the duration of the works the said road SHALL NOT BE USED by any class of vehicle.
