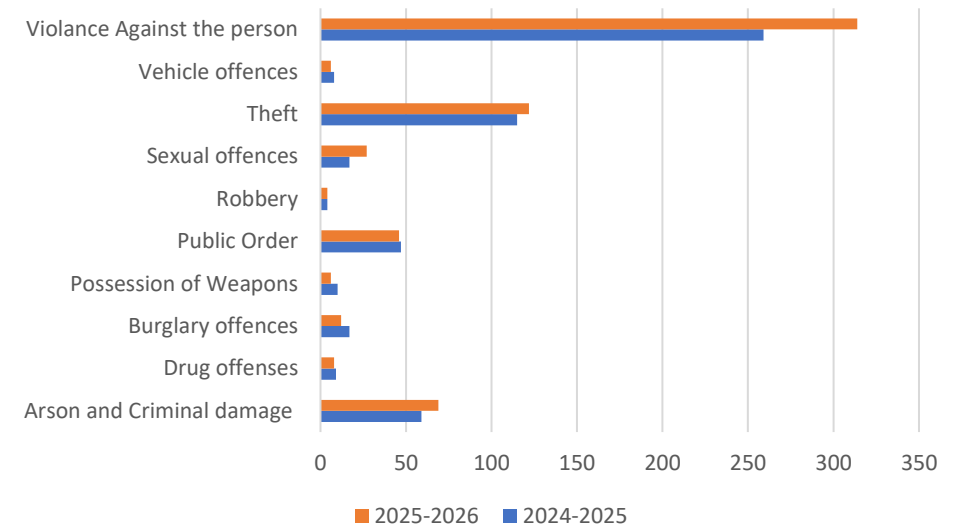

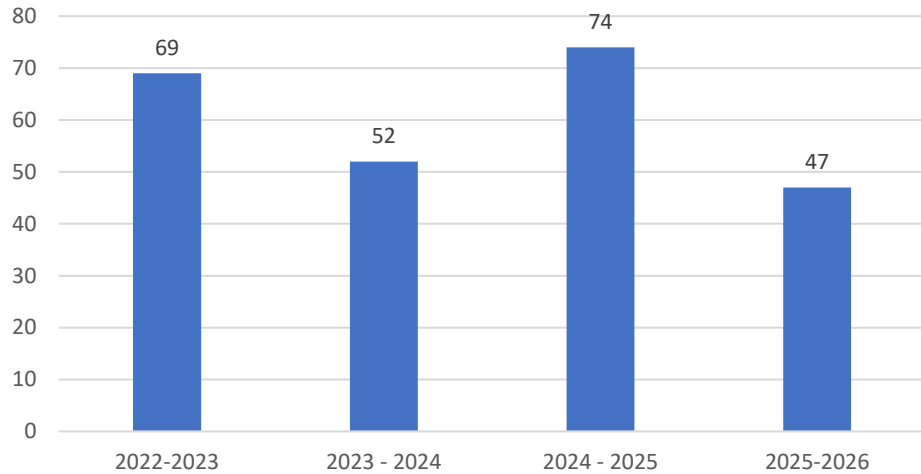

ASB by year from 2022 to 2026

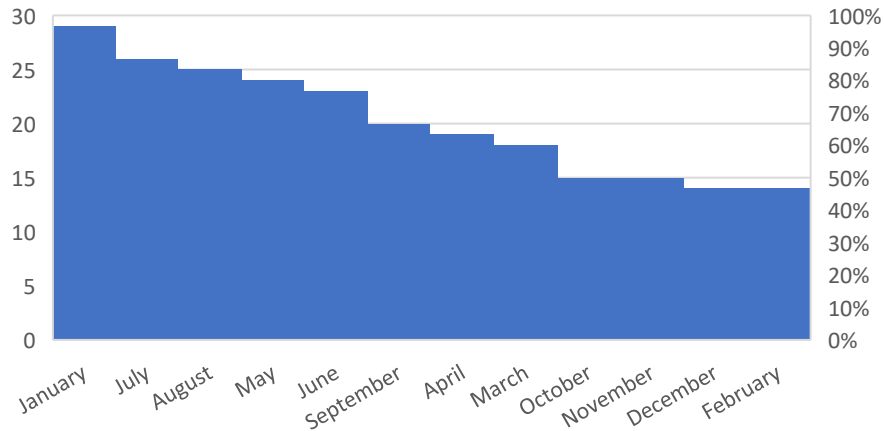


There has been a 36.5% decrease this year in comparison to last year for ASB.

ASB comparison by month from 2022 - 2026

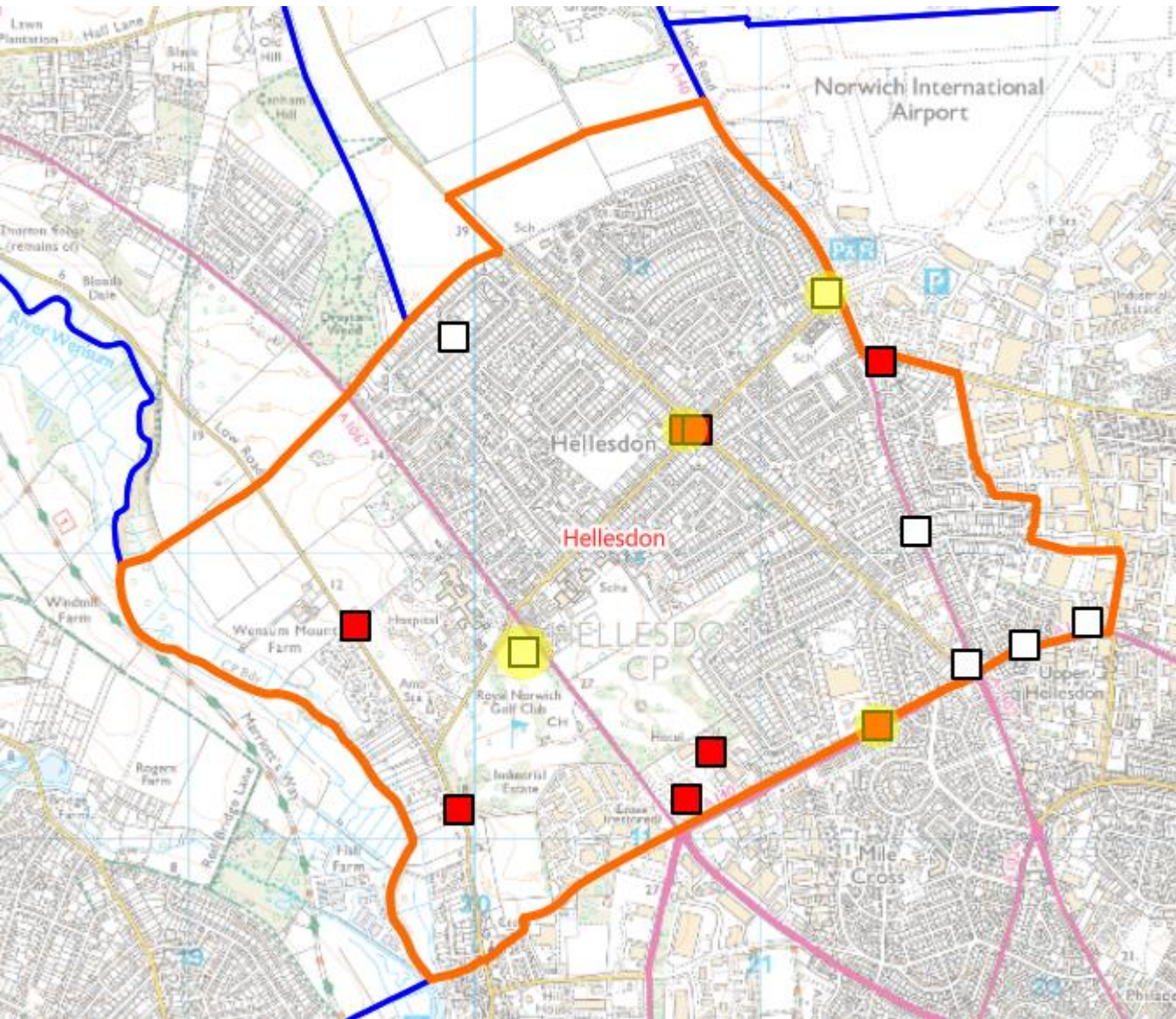


This graph shows the ASB volume by month from 2022-2026. With January as the highest and February as the lowest.

Hellesdon RTC data



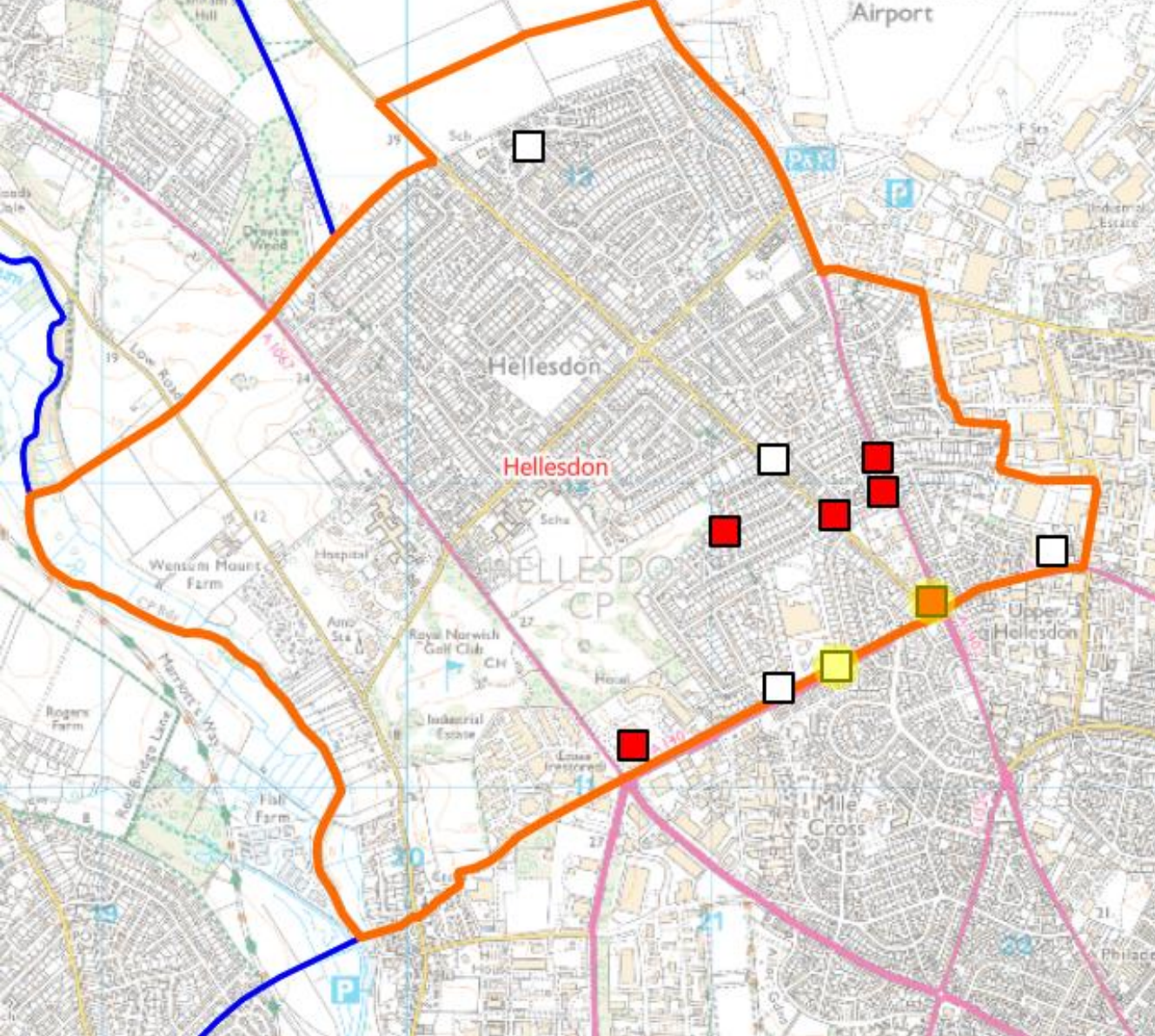
May, June and July

Eight non-injury RTCs – Two taking place on Holt / Cromer Road

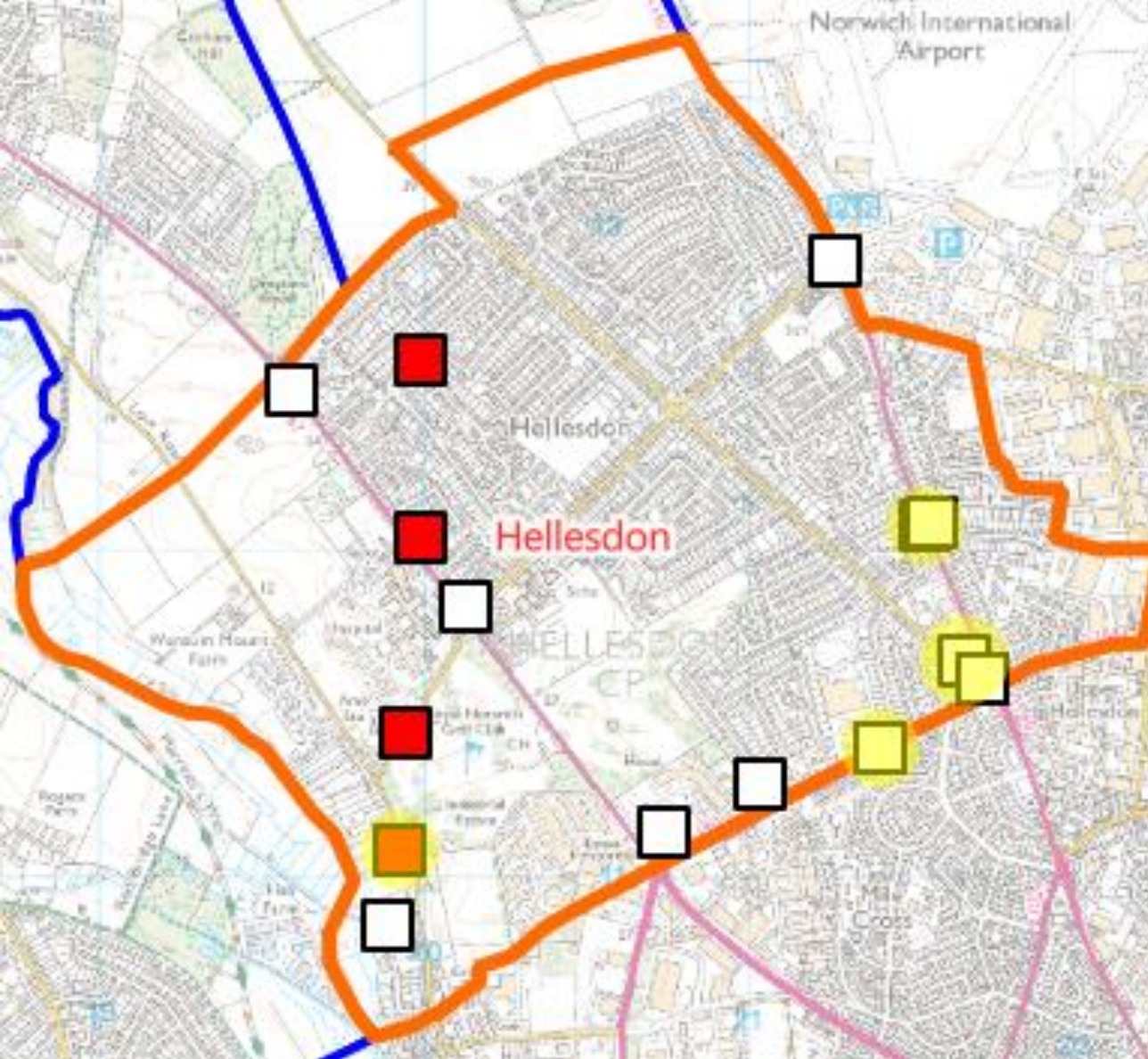
August, September and October

Seven personal injury's RTCS – Asda, Reepham Road, Cromer Road.

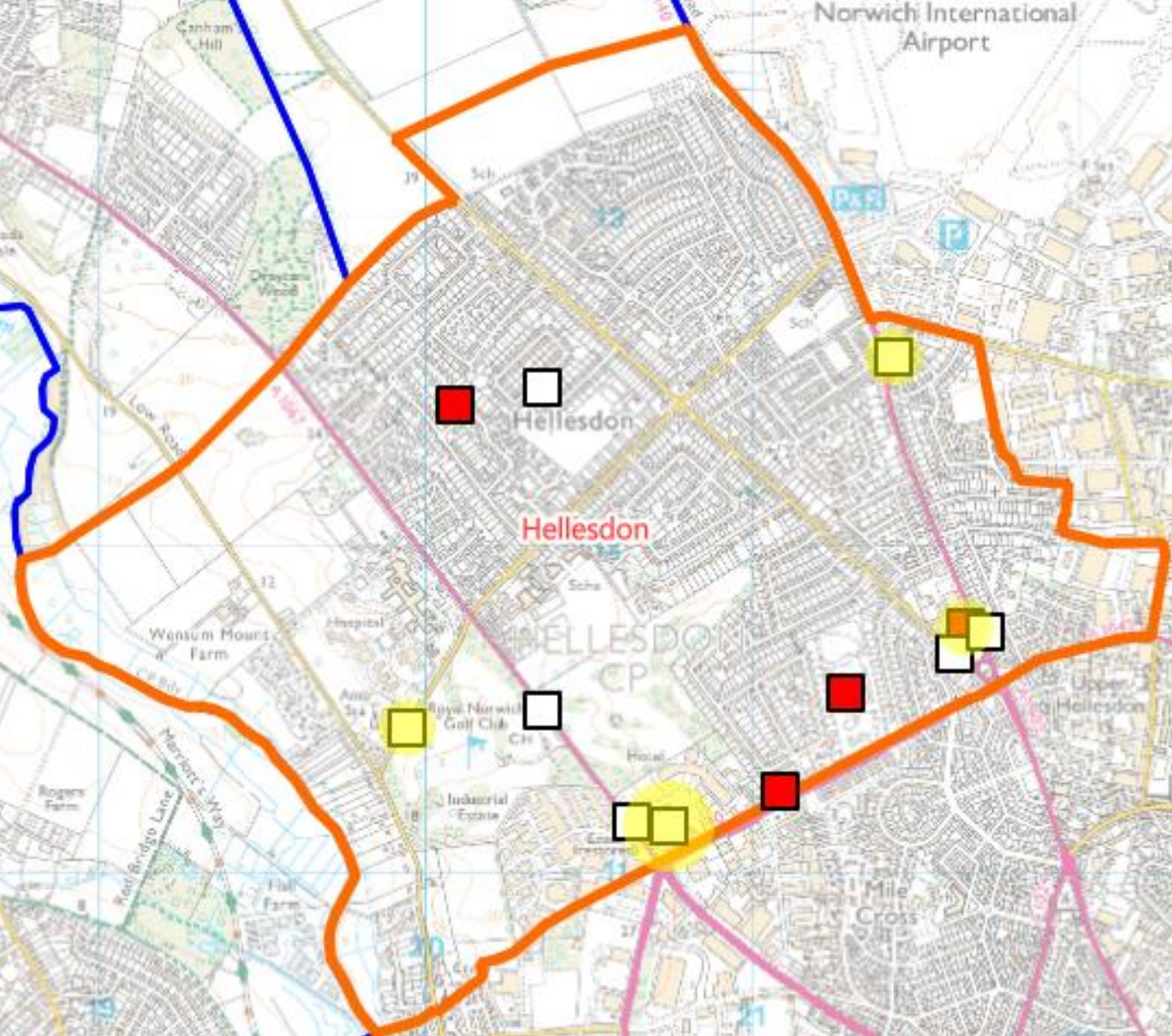
November, December and January

Seven personal injury's RTCS – Woodland Road, Hospital Lane, Low Road and Cromer Road.

February, March and April



Ten damage only RTCS – Some of which have taken place at Asda, Hospital Lane and Cromer Road.

Ten personal injury's RTCS – Boundary Road, B&Q and Cromer Road.

Since the introduction of the new builds on the Hellesdon Hospital site there has been a reduction in patients absconding.

As part of the problem solving plan we meet with matrons from the wards in a monthly meeting in order to review that months data and to discuss ongoing and emerging issues.



Engagements – Footbeat

- Footbeat is carried out on City View Road junction with Coronation Road in relation to parking issues, letters or tickets issued to those parking inconsiderately.

- The grounds of Hellesdon Hospital.
- The highest volume of police patrols have been carried out at the Hellesdon Recreation Ground, the library and Cottinghams Park.

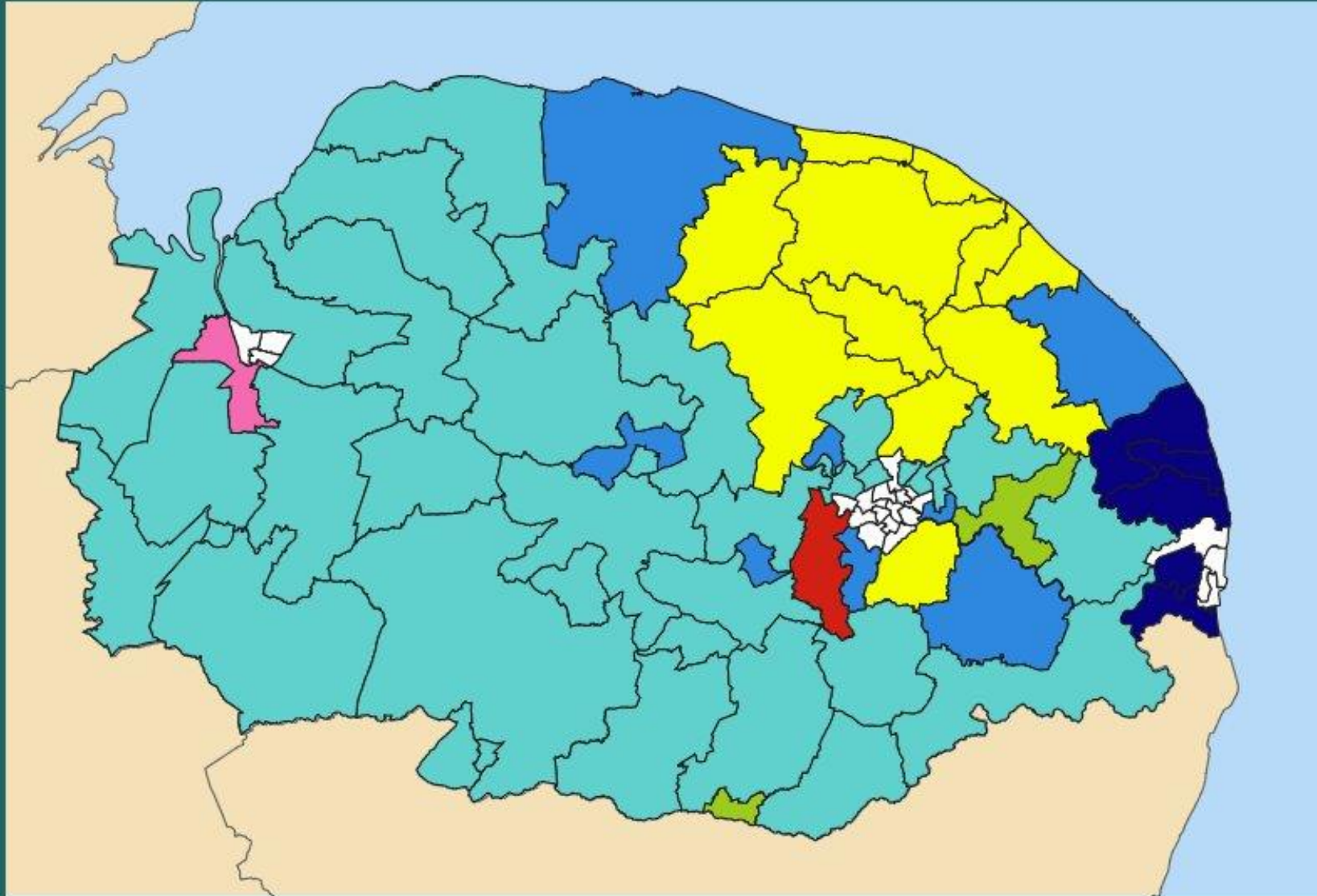

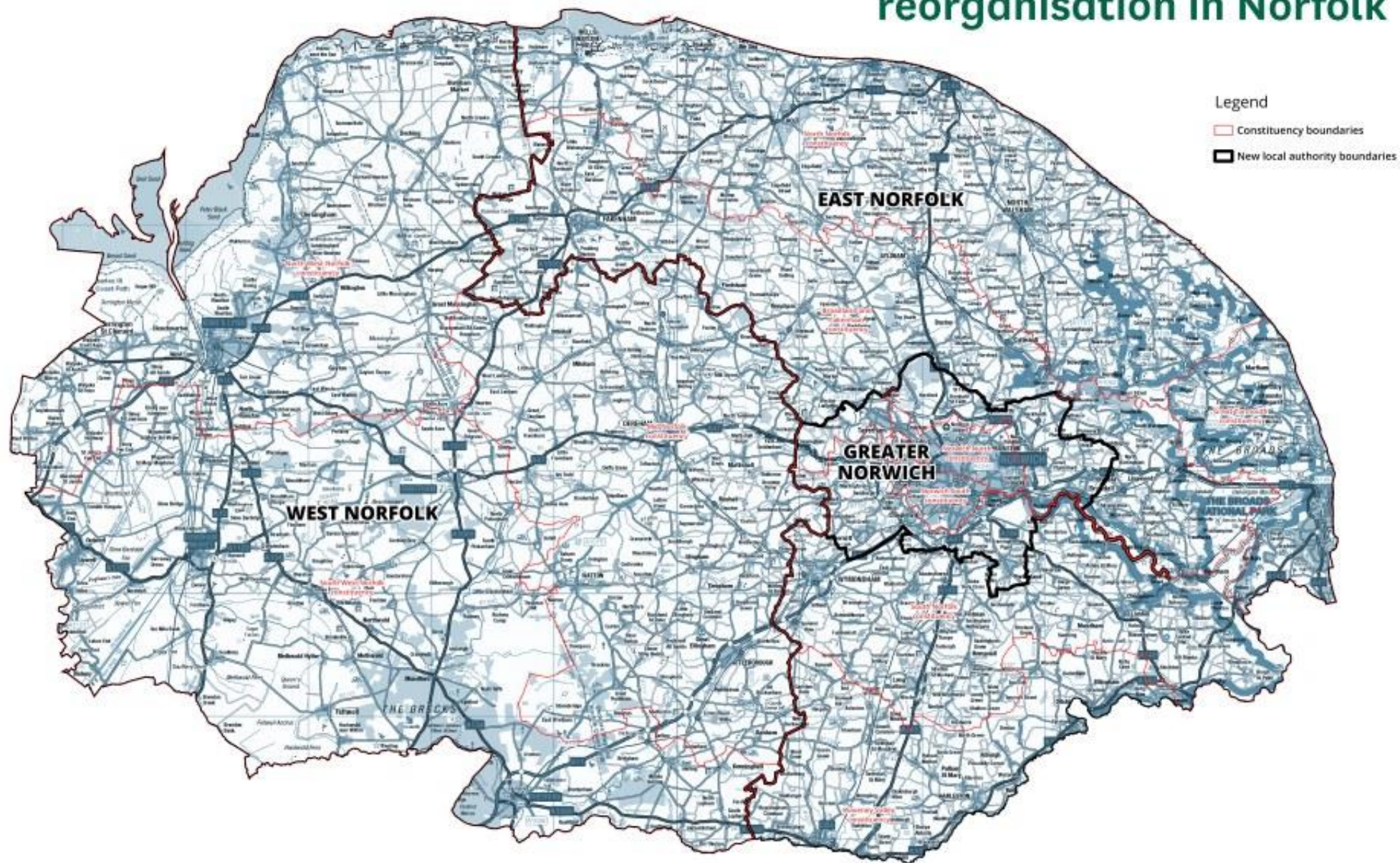

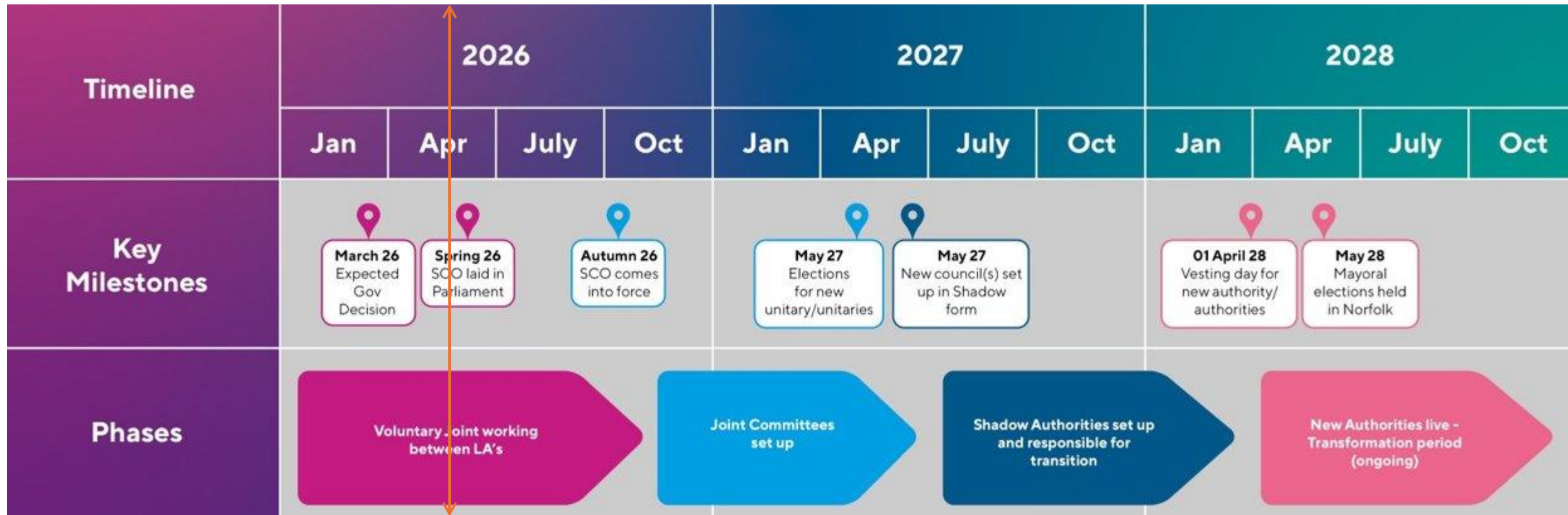
